## **PAUL HINDEMITH 1895-1963**

## Sehr langsam (Sonata No. 1)

It is fascinating to study the history of music along stylistic developmental lines. By the time of Paul Hindemith, serious music composition was in, among other things, a "neo-Baroque" frame of mind. The return to the Baroque side of that style was characterized by the increased use of counterpoint, the use of small performing forces, a somewhat improvisatory feeling within a more or less strict meter, and shorter movements. The contemporary side of the neo-Baroque included the avoidance of triads and other harmonically defining characteristics, which in Hindemith's case included a heavier use of stacked fourths rather than thirds. The present movement, marked *sehr langsam* ("very slowly"), is excerpted from Hindemith's first of three organ Sonatas.
